## The Juche City of Pyongyang under the Power of Marketization

## Pavel P. Em

Pyongyang is actively involved in the theatre of dramatic action taking place on the Korean peninsula. This presentation will discuss how the rapid transitions between political epochs from early history to nowadays have influenced the urban planning and development of Pyongyang. Even though the North Koreans with the support of some East European countries have made every effort to create the ideal socialist city, Pyongyang nonetheless has inherited many features of urban planning and architecture from the kingdom and colonial periods. However, dynamic marketization, beginning as a response to the economic crisis of the mid-1990s, has instigated a metamorphosis transforming Pyongyang into a post-socialist city before our eyes.

Pavel P. Em is a Visiting Scholar at the Seoul National University Asia Center (SNUAC) from March 2022. Before that Pavel was a Visiting Research Fellow at the Institute for Far Eastern Studies, Kyungnam University. Pavel obtained a Ph.D. degree in Urban Geography from the Moscow State University in 2013. He took post-doctoral programs at l'École des hautes études en sciences sociales (EHESS) in Paris (2017-2018) and at the Leiden University (2018-2019), each lasting one year. The results of his work are published in journal articles and in a book. Pavel has presented findings as a guest speaker in a number of institutions (SOAS University of London, Vienna University, Doshisha University), and as a speaker at many conferences both in Korean studies and geography. His research projects were supported by Korea Foundation (2017), the Academy of Korean Studies (2018), and the IFES MOU (2021).
